

Renaissance Man

Jersey boy Val Emmich makes the girls—and burly men—swoon with his indie pop tunes and dreamy acting, then goes home to work on his novel.

You may recognize Val Emmich as the hot intern on 30 Rock who turned Judah Friedlander's Boobs Magazine-reading character "gay for Jamie." Or perhaps you know him as the "manny" who set cougar hearts aflutter on Cashmere Mafia. But there's more to this Jersey City resident than just his roles as TV's resident man candy. In fact, the 28-year-old is a jack-of-all-trades. "I've always called myself a musician to avoid getting a

real job," says Val. "The acting thing snuck up on me—maybe I've done well because I didn't care."
